# 4 Background Review – Planning Provincial Policy Statement (2005)

Healthy, liveable and safe communities:

- promote efficient development and land use patterns;
- accommodate an appropriate range and mix of residential, employment, recreational and open space uses;
- avoid development and land use patterns which may cause environmental or public health and safety concerns;
- promote cost-effective development standards; and,
- ensure that necessary public infrastructure and facilities are or will be available



# 4 Background Review – Planning Greenbelt Plan (2005)

- The Plan identifies where urbanization should not occur in order to provide permanent protection to the agricultural land base and ecological features and functions
- Lands within some of the focused areas area identified as Natural Heritage System. These lands contain sensitive and/or significant natural features and functions
- Generally, a full range of existing and new agricultural, agricultural-related and secondary uses, normal farm practices are permitted subject to the policies of the Plan
- Lands included in the Greenbelt can not be considered for future urban development potential



### Background Review – Planning

Places to Grow: Growth Plan for the Greater Golden Horseshoe (2006)


"to create complete communities and to promote development that can support a variety of modes of transportation including transit"

- By 2031 1.5 million population + 780,000 employees in York Region (in 2006 population = 933,350, employment = 468,000)
- By 2015, and for each year thereafter, a minimum of 40% of all residential development occurring annually within each upper tier and single-tier municipality will be within the built-up area
- Minimum of 50 residents and jobs combined per hectare for Designated Greenfield Areas

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
